Supporting refugees and responding to asylum proposals

On 17 November, the government announced some major proposed changes to UK asylum policy. There is a briefing on the proposals from JPIT here: What are the government's asylum reform proposals? – Joint Public Issues Team

The President of Conference joined a public statement responding to the proposals, on behalf of the Methodist Church, which can be found here: Response to asylum reforms - The Methodist Church. This also includes a prayer.

The proposals will have created uncertainty and anxiety for many people who are currently in the asylum and immigration system. It should be stressed that the changes are just proposals at this stage, and most will require legislation and consultation before coming into effect. More guidance will be available on their implications for individuals at that point.

The Methodist Church is part of a new campaign that aims to show that not only are refugees welcome here, but that our communities stand wholeheartedly together. Focused on the first weekend of December (5-7 December), individuals, groups and organisations are invited to join in with creating public displays of orange hearts – a symbol of compassion for people fleeing war and persecution – in thousands of different ways in local communities. You can:

- Order free posters for your church and church members to display
- Pray for the campaign in your service on 7 December
- Organise a community event with a message of hope and welcome
- Meet your MP to show your support for refugees

Each year, the Methodist Church releases a short film as part of its Advent and Christmas campaign – a resource that reaches hundreds of thousands of people across social media and in churches. This film is designed to spark curiosity about faith and encourage people to take the next step on their journey of faith. Christmas is a season rich with opportunity to share the extraordinary good news we hold as the Church. This year's film is a little different. It tells a real story – following the journey of someone who discovers that they are a gift to others, that the Church can be a gift to them, and that Jesus is **the** ultimate gift for all. The story concludes in one of our vibrant Methodist communities, and while the film is slightly longer than previous years, we believe every moment is worth sharing. It will be released on Thursday 4 December on our website and through our social media channels. As the film follows a Cantonesespeaking community, the film will be released in the following formats, to allow as many people as possible to engage with the story:

- English-dubbed with British Sign Language

The film is part of our 2025 Advent and Christmas campaign, *Gifted*, which invites people to see themselves as a gift, the Church as a gift, and Jesus as **the** gift.
